

***Public Review Draft of the Prioritized List of  
Eligible Oahu Proposals Requesting Transportation Enhancement Funds***

March 28, 2007

Representatives from the OahuMPO’s Citizen Advisory Committee and the OahuMPO’s participating agencies formed an “Enhancement Panel” whose purpose it was to prioritize the eligible Oahu Enhancement proposals. The following table lists the rank of each proposal. Proposals that resulted in a “tie” score are listed in alphabetical order. Project proposals where only select portions of the proposal are eligible for enhancement funds are identified.

1- tie (20)	Kahuhipa Street Hydro-modification Device	This project proposes the installation of an in-line storm drain pollutant collector, hydro-modification device to collect pollutants from highway run-off along Kahuhipa Street. <i>Select portions of this project are eligible for Enhancement funds.</i>	Highway Runoff Mitigation
1 – tie (20)	Leeward Bikeway – Phases I and II	This project proposes paving a shared-use path within the former OR&L right-of-way, beginning at Waipio Point Access Road and ending at Lualualei Naval Road.	Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities
3 – tie (15)	Pedestrian Plan <sup>1</sup>	This project proposes development of the Oahu element of the proposed Hawaii Department of Transportation’s Pedestrian Plan.	Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety and Education Activities
3 – tie (15)	Waimanalo Beach Road Bus Stop Improvement	This project proposes the relocation of an existing bus stop on Kalaniana’ole Highway fronting the Aloha Gas Station / 7-Eleven Convenience Store to the edge of neighboring Waimanalo Beach Park, closer to a marked crosswalk.	Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities
5 (14)	Meheula Parkway Bicycle Lane	This project proposes lane striping to both sides of the entire length of Meheula Parkway to include a bike lane, bike lane symbols, and bike lane signage.	Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities

<sup>1</sup> The Enhancement Panel believes this is a very important project and urges the Hawaii Department of Transportation to begin work on development of this plan as soon as possible. Additionally, the InterAgency COORDINATION Councils feel very strongly that pedestrian safety is the number one priority on Oahu.

7 (9)	Kipapa Gulch Bikeway	This project proposes the construction of a shared-use bicycle and pedestrian path through Kipapa Gulch.	Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities
8 - tie (6)	Laniakea Beach Road Relocation	This project proposes the landward relocation of Kamehameha Highway at Laniakea Beach, Kaiwailoa, Oahu. <i>Select portions of this project are eligible for Enhancement funds.</i>	Highway Runoff Mitigation
8 - tie (6)	Hawaii Capital Cultural District – Pedestrian Enhancement	This project proposes signage and way-finding directories, pedestrian amenities, visitor information centers, and pilot trolley service. <i>Select portions of this project are eligible for Enhancement funds.</i>	Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety and Education Activities
10 (5)	University of Hawaii (UH) Bicycle Planning and Facilities Design Study	This project proposes background research on bicycle planning, safety, and facilities design; development of a plan to improve access, safety, and use of bicycles as a transportation mode at UH; and initial design work in terms of bicycle facilities on the UH campus. <i>Select portions of this project are eligible for Enhancement funds.</i>	Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety and Education Activities
11 (4)	University Avenue Beautification	This project proposes landscaping improvements along University Avenue, between Varsity Place and the Interstate H-1 on- and off-ramps.	Landscaping and Scenic Beautification
12 (3)	Nimitz Highway Beautification	This project proposes landscaping improvements along Nimitz Highway, from the Honolulu International Airport to Waikiki.	Landscaping and Scenic Beautification
