What is the TIP?

- A four-year schedule of surface transportation projects
 - Consistent with the ORTP 2040
 - Ready-to-go
 - Local match (if applicable)
 - Planning factors
 - Consistent with the Oahu Regional ITS Architecture
- Overall
 - ≈\$717 million for highways projects 2015-2018
 - ≈\$3.704 billion for transit projects 2015-2018



Revisions to the TIP

- **Rev. #10 was a Pre-approved Administrative Modification**
 - Does not require solicitation of public comment or re-demonstration of financial constraint.
 - Policy Board is provided with copies
- **Rev. #11 is an Expedited Administrative Modification**
 - Submitted directly to the Policy Board without prior review by the ACs or solicitation of public comment.
- **Rev. #12 is an Amendment**
 - Submitted to the Technical Advisory Committee, the Policy Board, and the Governor's designee for inclusion in the STIP.



Draft FFYs 2015-2018 TIP Revision #12


- 46% of projects modified in Rev. 10, 11, or 12
- 2 proposed project changes (of 84 total projects)
 - Adding (2)
- Fiscal constraint was not negatively affected by these Amendments



Draft FFYs 2015-2018 TIP Revision #12

- OS65 Kamehameha Highway (RTE 83) Shoreline Mitigation, vicinity of Kaaawa, Hauula, Punaluu and Kuuloa
 - Request to add new Design-Build project. C.1
- OC26 Transportation Alternative Program (State)
 - Request to add new program. C.1

OS65 Kamehameha Highway (RTE 83) Shoreline Mitigation





Draft FFYs 2015-2018 TIP Revision #12

- OC26 Transportation Alternative Program (State)
 - TOD Wayfinding Master Plan
 - Date Street Bikeway Bridge
 - Photovoltaic Lighting and Real-time Information Signs at Various Bus Stops on Oahu
 - Haleiwa Road Multi-use Path
 - Bike Share Stations and Bikes
 - Chinatown Bicycle Facility
 - \$2,759,36 in requests (\$1,767,360 in requests for FFY 2016)
 - HDOT is finalizing the evaluation process and will be moving to award shortly



Title VI and Environmental Justice (T6/EJ) Analysis

- Public Outreach
 - Targeted T6/EJ parties
- Equity
 - Percent investment by Census block group
 - Investment in T6/EJ Census block groups: 12%
 - Census block groups designated as T6/EJ: 13%
 - Indicates an equal share of the investments.
 - Average per capita investment
 - T6/EJ: \$2,481
 - Non-T6/EJ: \$3,708
 - T6/EJ block groups receive about \$1,227 (33%) less per capita in TIP expenditures than non-T6/EJ block groups.



TIP Revision #12

- Title VI & Environmental Justice Analysis
 - Conclusions
 - Percent investment did not change significantly for both the T6/EJ and Non-T6/EJ block groups.
 - Investment is similar to FFYs 2015-2018 TIP as of Rev. 9 when T6/EJ individuals received about \$1,750 (37%) less than non-T6/EJ individuals
 - Indirect benefits to T6/EJ areas are not measured in this analysis

TIP Revision #9 Intergovernmental Review

- 343 CAC members and interested parties received the Draft TIP revision 12.
 - 0 Comments from a member of public
- 95 government agencies and stakeholder organizations were provided the Draft TIP revision 12.
 - 7 Comments
 - (1) from DPP, (2) Honolulu Fire Department, (1) National Park Service Community Assistance Program, (2) Department of Transportation Services, (1) Department of Parks and Recreation.
 - 7 Agencies responded with “no comment”
 - The Board of Water Supply, DLNR State Parks, DLNR Aquatic Resources, DOE Student Transportation Services, Honolulu Police Department, Marine Corps Base Hawaii, and US Fish and Wildlife Services.



Intergovernmental Review Comments

- DPP – “In recognition of sea level rise as an impact and considering “the very high probability of further erosion in the immediate future,” (Transportation Improvement Program FFYs 2015-2018 Revision #12, pg. 4) including the potential need for recurring project repairs, OS65 Kamehameha Highway (RTE 83) Shoreline Mitigation should include an analysis of the possible impact of sea level rise on the design-build project.”
 - HDOT Response: “We will forward DPP's comments to the Shoreline program manager and OS65 project manager to consider in the development of both the project and shoreline program.”



Intergovernmental Review Comments

- Honolulu Fire Department – “Kamehameha Highway Shoreline Mitigation Project: Potential impacts to public safety agency emergency response access”
- Honolulu Fire Department – “TAP: Potential impacts to public safety agency emergency response access”
 - HDOT Response: “It is HDOT policy to maintain access for emergency response vehicles when we construct our projects. If special coordination is needed with emergency response services, HDOT will initiate that coordination. We will forward HFD's comments to the Shoreline program manager and OS65 project manager.”



Intergovernmental Review Comments

- National Park Service Community Assistance Program – “Refers to the design-build emergency work on Kamehameha Highway. This road is an important commuting route and the only way to traverse the windward side of the island. In addition, it bisects numerous communities and connects people to beach parks, recreation areas, neighborhoods, schools, businesses, and residential areas. The road improvements will need to include complete street considerations. This is a major bus route, as well as a walking and biking area. Safe access for all users: pedestrians, school children, bikes, handicap, and kapuna. Please address complete streets to make this improvement safe for all users (vehicles, busses, pedestrians, bicyclists, etc.). Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns surrounding these comments. This is a very important issue for partners that I work with.”
 - HDOT Response: “It is HDOT's policy to consider complete streets improvements in all of our projects... If feasible, we will implement appropriate complete street scopes of work. We will forward NPS's comments to the Shoreline program manager and OS65 project manager.”



Intergovernmental Review Comments

- Department of Transportation Services –
“The Department of Transportation Services supports the additions of OS65 and OC26 to the TIP.”
 - HDOT Response: “Thank you for your support.”



Intergovernmental Review Comments

- Department of Parks and Recreation – “The Department of Parks and Recreation looks forward to being a consulted party in the new Design-Build Shoreline mitigation project to repair.”
 - HDOT Response: “We will forward DPR's comments to our Shoreline program manager and the OS65 project manager.”

Draft FFYs 2015-2018 TIP Revision #12

- The net impact to FHWA funds programmed for Oahu from Rev. #11 to Rev. #12:
 - State of Hawaii – Sponsored \$5,080,000
 - C&C of Honolulu – Sponsored \$1,840,000
- The net impact to FHWA funds programmed for Oahu from Rev. #9 to Rev. #12:
 - State of Hawaii – Sponsored (\$911,000)
 - C&C of Honolulu – Sponsored \$11,256,000
