Pricing Solutions – A Case Study About London’s Congestion Charging Scheme
Traffic congestion imposes societal costs in the form of time lost to productivity. Traditional approaches to solving congestion have focuses on roadway expansion; Pricing solutions recognize that transportation facilities (roadways, vehicles, and parking spaces) do not have infinite capacity. The goal of pricing solutions is to incentive people to travel by other modes, at other times of days, or on other (less-congested) routes. Cordon pricing around the urban core in London, United Kingdom will be discussed as a case study.
