

The mission of the CAC Subcommittee on Pedestrian Safety is as follows:

1. Identify and list the measures that the Highway Division of the State Department of Transportation, The City and County Department of Transportation Services, and the City and County Police Department are currently taking to reduce the number of pedestrian deaths and injuries on O‘ahu to persons age 65 and older.
2. Review the Hawai‘i State Department of health data on pedestrian deaths and injuries on O‘ahu to persons age 65 and older.
3. Identify and list the measures that the Highway Division of the State Department of Transportation, The City and County Department of Transportation Services, and the City and County Police Department are planning to take in the next two to three years to reduce the number of pedestrian deaths and injuries on O‘ahu to persons age 65 and older.
4. Make such recommendations and/or suggestions as it see fits that in the Subcommittee’s view have significant potential to reduce the number of pedestrian deaths and injuries on O‘ahu to persons age 65 and older.
5. Submit a draft report to the Highway Division of the State Department of Transportation, The City and County Department of Transportation Services, and the City and County Police Department for comment and reaction.
6. Submit a final report to the Citizens Advisory Committee, which if it so chooses, may adopt it as submitted or amended as it sees fit, forwarding its final recommendation to the Policy Committee for further disposition

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Proposal on How the Subcommittee Should Proceed

1. Write a letter to Marshall Ando, Highway Administrator, Highway Division, Department of Transportation, requesting data on measures the Highway Division is currently taking to reduce the number of pedestrian deaths and injuries on O'ahu to persons age 65 and older. The data can come in the form convenient to the Division, e.g., narrative, PowerPoint. Secondly, request data on measures the Division is planning to take in the next two to three years to reduce the number of pedestrian deaths and injuries on O'ahu to persons age 65 and older.

Write a letter to Jon Nouchi, Deputy Director, City and County Department of Transportation Services, requesting data on measures the Department is currently taking to reduce the number of pedestrian deaths and injuries on O'ahu to persons age 65 and older.
