Executive Director's Report

Accomplishments and Progress

1. We are actively recruiting to fill our vacant Senior Transportation Planner position and ask you to encourage anyone who may be interested to apply. Recruitment has also begun for a Transportation Intern.

2. Randolph Sykes rejoined OahuMPO this week and will be working on special projects such as the 5-year Strategic Plan mandated in the 2014 & 2018 Certification Reviews, the Financial & Administrative Supplemental Agreements which expire at the end of FY2021, and assisting with the Senior Transportation Planner recruitment.
3. The Central Oahu Transportation Study is nearing completion. The Central O'ahu Transportation Study Draft Report is available for public and inter-government comment through October 7, 2019. The report recommends 23 transportation projects, including six transit projects, nine roadway projects, and eight bicycle and pedestrian packages.
