A. 2020 Congestion Management Process (CMP) Report

All Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) with a population greater than 200,000 are required to have a Congestion Management Process (CMP), including OahuMPO. The purpose of a CMP is to identify the process for collecting congestion related data, develop performance measures used to report congestion data to the public, and guide funding toward projects and strategies which most effectively address congestion.
