Executive Director's Report

Accomplishments and Progress

OahuMPO released the public draft of the FFY 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Revision #20 for public and intergovernmental review on May 13, 2021. The public draft may be viewed at: https://www.oahumpo.org/?wpfb_dl=2228
Comments are due by June 4, 2021.

OahuMPO is seeking feedback on the FFYs 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program proposed project and program list. The TIP identifies highway, transit, arterial and local street, pedestrian, bicycle, and alternative transportation projects and programs that will receive federal transportation funds in the short-term. Projects and programs must be listed in the TIP before they can receive any federal funds.

FFYs 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program Open Houses (TIP)

OahuMPO staff will be co-hosting three TIP Open Houses with representatives from Hawaii Department of Transportation, City and County of Honolulu Department of Transportation Services, and Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation. The City and County of Honolulu Department of Transportation Services has confirmed a representative will be in attendance to all the meetings. Representatives from the Hawaii Department of Transportation and Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation will be available at both weekday sessions.

Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)

The TAC met on May 14, 2021 and received a presentation on the Final Draft Overall Work Program (OWP) FY 2022 and HDOT's Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Funding proposal. All items were recommended to the Policy Board for approval. Their next meeting is scheduled for June 16, 2021.

Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC)

The CAC met on May 5, 2021 and received a presentation on the FY 2022 Overall Work Program (OWP) and recommended the Policy Board approve the final draft FY 2022 OWP to include continued funding for the Makaha Beach Farrington Highway Realignment Feasibility Study and remove funding for the Ala Moana Transit Alternatives Analysis. Their next meeting is scheduled for June 2, 2021.
