Executive Director's Report

Accomplishments and Progress

OahuMPO released the public draft of the FFYs 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Revision #20 for public and intergovernmental review on May 13, 2021. The public draft may be viewed at: https://www.oahumpo.org/?wpfb_dl=2228 Comments are due by June 4, 2021.

OahuMPO is seeking feedback on the FFYs 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) proposed project and program list. The TIP identifies highway, transit, arterial and local street, pedestrian, bicycle, and alternative transportation projects and programs that will receive federal transportation funds in the short-term. Projects and programs must be listed in the TIP before they can receive any federal funds.

OahuMPO staff will be co-hosting three TIP Open Houses with representatives from Hawaii Department of Transportation, City and County of Honolulu Department of Transportation Services, and Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation. The purpose of the Open Houses is to explain who OahuMPO is, what the TIP is and why it is important, and then provide attendees the opportunity to ask questions and provide comments about projects and programs in the TIP. The City and County of Honolulu Department of Transportation Services has confirmed a representative will be in attendance to all the meetings, and representatives from the Hawaii Department of Transportation and Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation will be available at both the weekday sessions.

Policy Board (PB)

The Policy Board met on May 25, 2021 and received presentations on the FY 2022 Final Draft Overall Work Program (OWP) which is the OahuMPO's operating budget that identifies all metropolitan planning studies, projects, and work elements that staff and agency partners will be working on in FY 2022; received and approved the updated revision to the Finance Supplemental Agreement 2022-2024; received and approved Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Sub-Appropriation Funding.

The Permitted Interaction Group (PIG) for the Evaluation of the OahuMPO Executive Director presented their report and the Policy Board established a Permitted Interaction Group (PIG) to conduct a search for and evaluation of candidates for the Executive Director position.

Unless noted all items were approved by the Policy Board. Their next meeting is scheduled for June 29, 2021.

Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)

The TAC met on May 14, 2021 and received the presentations on the Final Draft FY 2022 Overall Work Program (OWP), and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Funding. All items were recommended to the Policy Board for approval.

Their next meeting is scheduled for June 16, 2021.
