Executive Director's Report

Accomplishments and Progress

OahuMPO is seeking feedback on the Draft FFYs 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP identifies highway, transit, arterial and local street, pedestrian, bicycle, and alternative transportation projects and programs that will receive federal transportation funds in the short-term. Projects and programs must be listed in the TIP before they can receive any federal funds.

FFYs 2022-2025 Transportation Improvement Program Open Houses

OahuMPO staff co-hosted three TIP Open Houses with representatives from Hawaii Department of Transportation, City and County of Honolulu Department of Transportation Services, and Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation. The purpose of the Open Houses was to explain who OahuMPO is, what the TIP is and why it is important, and provide attendees the opportunity to ask questions and provide comments about projects and programs in the TIP. The three virtual meetings occurred on Saturday, June 5th, Monday, June 7th, and Monday, June 14th.

A total of 20 community members participated and 30 comments and questions were provided and asked.

Policy Board (PB)

The Policy Board met on May 25, 2021 and received presentations on the Final Draft Overall Work Program (OWP) FY 2022, the 2022-2024 updated revision to the Finance Supplemental Agreement, and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Sub-Appropriation Funding. All items were approved by the Policy Board.

The Permitted Interaction Group (PIG) for the Evaluation of the OahuMPO Executive Director presented their report and the Policy Board established a Permitted Interaction Group (PIG) to conduct the search for a new Executive Director. The next meeting Policy Board meeting is scheduled for June 29, 2021.

Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC)

The CAC met on June 2, 2021 and received a presentation on the Transportation Improvement Program FFYs 2019-2022 Revision #19 and Revision #20. Their next meeting is scheduled for July 7, 2021.
