 - a. Overall Work Program (OWP) Work Element Presentation: Work Where You Live

DTS' consultant team will give a presentation on the Work Where You Live telework study funded by the OWP FY2021. The study objective was to assess the telework experience of Oahu-based State of Hawaii and City & County of Honolulu employees during the Stay-at-Home/Work-from-Home period of the COVID-19 pandemic with the intent of formulating and promoting updated telework policies that provide State and City/County employees with greater flexibility and options for working from home.

b. Overall Work Program (OWP) FY 2022 Revision #1

The Overall Work Program (OWP) describes OahuMPO's annual budget and federally funded subrecipient planning studies. c. Overall Work Program (OWP) Work Element Presentation: Review and Update of Planned Rights-of-Way for Existing Streets

The City and County of Honolulu, with funding from the Oahu MPO, is reviewing and updating its Right-of-Way Widths for Planned Streets to reflect current conditions, land use and multimodal plans, as well as street type assignments to define priorities and guide implementation of future improvements in alignment with Honolulu's Complete Streets Ordinance. DTS will be providing an overview of the project and is seeking feedback on the proposed street type assignments. **Deadline for public comments is September 30, 2021.**
