### Executive Director's Report

#### *Accomplishments*

The FY2023 Overall Work Program Final Draft was endorsed by the Policy Board at their meeting on May 31 and has been sent to the FHWA and FTA for approval.

#### *Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)*

TIP Revision #4, which includes pre-approved administrative modifications, was requested to be incorporated into the STIP on May 11. TIP Revision #4 can be viewed here:

The next cycle of TIP revisions began on April 11 and a draft TIP revision document went out for public comment and intergovernmental review from May 10 to 24.

#### *Procurement*

A consultant has been selected for the Travel Demand Forecasting Model (TDFM) contract procurement. The contract documents have been approved by the Attorney General's office and a Notice to Proceed (NTP) will be issued soon.

Six proposals were received for a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the Oahu Regional Transportation Plan (ORTP) 2050 Consultant procurement that closed on June 3. The Evaluation Committee is reviewing the proposals and will meet soon to make a selection.

#### *Policy Board (PB)*

The Policy Board met on May 31 and received presentations on the Overall Work Program (OWP) FY 2023 Final Draft, the HDOT Mid-Range Transportation Plan, and the 2022 HART Recovery Plan. The next Policy Board meeting is scheduled for June 28.

#### *Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC)*

The Citizens Advisory Committee met on June 1 and received presentations on the transportation Improvement Program FFYs 2022-2025 Revisions #5 and #6 and voted to recommend the Policy Board approve the documents.

They also received a presentation from Larry Veray of Neighborhood Board (NB) #21 on NB 21's resolution regarding the Hawaii Authority for Rapid Transportation's (HART) deferment of the Pearl Highlands Park and Ride Garage and of the H2 Off Ramp. The CAC's next scheduled meeting is on Wednesday, July 06 at 2:00 p.m.

### ***Personnel and Training***

OahuMPO's new Assistant Transportation Planner, Dallas Ige, started on May 16. Dallas brings a background in data analytics and planning and will be supporting a variety of projects including the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

The OahuMPO Executive Director attended the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations (AMPO) Planning Tools and Training Symposium in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, held on May 16-19. The in-person symposium brought together MPO staff and practitioners to share information on a variety of MPO technical issues and provided peer-to-peer training for the MPO community to discuss challenges, opportunities, and implementation strategies.
