Executive Director's Report

Oahu Regional Transportation Plan (ORTP)

A meeting of the ORTP Working Group was held on October 19. The two new consultant teams (PBR-Hawaii/Nelson Nygaard, and Urban Logiq) provided an overview of their firms and a summary of their tasks on the project.

FY2022 Audit

The OahuMPO FY2022 audit is now wrapping up, and the results are expected soon.

National Household Travel Survey (NHTS)

The OahuMPO is currently participating in the next generation National Household Travel Survey with the Federal Highway Administration, through November 2022. Surveys are being sent out at random to households on Oahu, and we are encouraging residents to help with this effort aimed at better understanding how people travel on Oahu. The results will help officials and planners determine where and how to make transportation investments, such as bridges and roads as well as facilities for bicycling, walking and transit. To help inform the public about the program, a press release was distributed on October 5.

Personnel and Training

Throughout October, Zakari has been participating in an on-line training program related to data analytics.

This week, Nicki and Mark are attending the Association of MPOs annual conference, being held in Minneapolis, from October 24-27.

Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC)

The CAC met on October 4 and received presentations from representatives of HDOT, DTS, and HART, who provided a high-level overview of their current priorities along with important updates. CAC members were given an opportunity to ask questions following the reports.

They also held a discussion regarding membership and specifically discussed the status of several organizations that have missed 3 meetings over the past year. No action was taken.

The next CAC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, November 2 at 2:00 p.m.

Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)

The TAC met on October 14. They received a presentation on a proposed update to the Overall Work Program (OWP) Processes and Procedures and discussed proposed planning studies for the upcoming FY 2024-2025 OWP. They also received presentation on the draft 5-year Strategic Plan, and the Oahu Project Management Training Program.
